letter from the president

Dearest GALA Colleagues:

My name is Maria-Elena Grant. For the past two years I've served as the Vice President of the GALA Board of Directors, and I now have the honor of assuming the role of President. Despite taking on these leadership roles, and the fact that this is my second time on the board, you may not know me. So let me introduce myself.

The first thing I'd like you to know is that I sing 2nd Soprano with a GALA chorus named Lavender Light: the Black and People of All Colors Lesbian and Gay Gospel Choir in New York City. We've been making music for 37 years now, and I have been a member since 1990!

Like many of you, being a member of a chorus that is part of the GALA network has transformed my life. But, when I first joined Lavender Light, I didn't know that we were part of an LGBTQIA+ international movement that would one day grow to be almost 200 choruses strong. That realization didn't happen until later, when I was elected as the chair of Lavender Light and went to my first GALA leadership conference in 1994 in Charlotte, NC. I didn't know anyone at the conference and initially I was overwhelmed. Despite these feelings, I attended workshops and roundtable discussions; had lunches with people I'd never met before, and slowly began to make friends. By the end of the weekend (and after a whirlwind of activity and campaigning) I was nominated from the floor of the hotel ballroom and elected to my first term on the GALA Board of Directors, and I served for six consecutive years. Initially I was a regular member, then served as board secretary and finally and most proudly, I was on the first and only all-female executive committee of the board. After my sixth year, I left the board to focus more fully on chorus life in New York. By then I had also sung with Lavender Light at two Festivals (Tampa and San Jose) and felt proud to be part of something so extraordinary. Attending Festival really is a life changing experience that every singer should have!

Then in 2014, I received a call which would prove to be another pivotal GALA moment for me. I was invited to become part of a working group that would eventually grow into what is now known as The New Harmony Task Force. As New Harmony works to complete our 2nd workbook, I am beyond proud of the work we have accomplished with many choruses throughout our network. It is an honor to work with our members as they look at issues of equity, access and belonging and work to strengthen their choruses and create meaningful change, allowing for a more sustainable future.

In 2018 I was once again nominated for the board, was elected, and began serving in January of 2019. And now, as I begin the fifth year of the second time I've been on this board, I am stepping into the role of President.

I would be remiss if I didn't take this opportunity to thank Michael Tate for his leadership and for being my friend. As the Executive team and I gear up for what promises to be a very exciting year (you will read more about that throughout this report) and as we prepare for Festival 2024, we will miss having his voice at our table. I send him love and wish him all good things.

And to all of you, in this coming year I wish you the gift of unexpected encounters with inspiration, joy, uplift, resistance, & healing as we continue to make beautiful music together.



letter from the executive director

What a year! There is much to be thankful for and several causes for concern. Most of our choruses are back to live rehearsals and performances and have adapted to life with COVID – we are even beginning to see value in some of the lessons the pandemic has taught us.

While we think of the LGBTQ choral movement as being mature there is an explosion of new choruses in Latin America led by our friends at Coro Gay Ciudad de Mexico and GALA board member Oscar Urtusastegui. The LGBTQ choral associations from around the world are working together in the Global Alliance of Queer Choirs to increase awareness and support emerging LGBTQ choruses around the world. Our movement is resilient and continues to grow! The Respect for Marriage Act passed the legislature and has been signed into law by the President here in the United States protecting hard-won rights.

Other developments were far more concerning. Women's rights remain under attack exemplified by the U.S. Supreme Court decision overturning Roe v Wade, the death of Mahsa Amini in Iran for allegedly breaking hijab rules and the skyrocketing cases of femicide around the world. The attack at Club Q in Colorado Springs highlighted again the violence against members of our LGBTQ community. Don't Say Gay laws and legislation restricting the rights of trans youth have passed in a number of states and multiple states are passing laws that ban anyone performing onstage as other than their birth sex (TN, FL, TX among others).

All of the above tells us that there is still much work to be done to ensure that people of all gender identities and sexualities can live in a world that respects their choices and recognizes the rights of all. Our LGBTQ choral movement continues to grow around the world raising its collective voice in support of freedom and respect. As we look forward to Festival 2024, let's commit ourselves to celebrating our victories but making sure we raise our voices in protest against ignorance and hate.



GALA LEADERSHIP SYMPOSIUM

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GALA Choruses is presenting a new series of online workshops and conversations designed for chorus leaders. These webinars are being held in lieu of an in-person Symposium during 2022–23, in accordance with our plans to alternate live and online symposia in order to provide opportunities for all GALA member choruses to participate. Online sessions began October 2022 and will run through May 2023.

There will be programming for every chorus leadership role, sessions related to Festival 2024 planning, and relevant topics such as Copyright and Licensing, Dealing with Mental Health Issues within a chorus, and The Aging Voice.

We're especially excited to feature a series of six webinars presented by Toni Capra, founder of Consultare Partners, a consulting firm working with non-profit organizations to maximize their impact and to accomplish meaningful results. Ms. Capra earned a BA in vocal performance and an MA in non-profit management, so she knows where our choruses are coming from. Capra's webinars will each have a participant limit of only 15 people, so register early!





Back in the 1970s, when the first LGBT and Feminist choruses formed in the USA, it was still decidedly dangerous to be thought of as queer, let alone to admit as much. When San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus put "Gay" right in their chorus' name, it sent shock waves throughout the country's music communities. But then others bravely followed, a joint concert was produced at Carnegie Hall, the GALA association was formed, and more groups in more cities (and countries) began forming proud LGBTQ+ choruses, so that it is no longer mortally dangerous to sing in a "gay choir" in North America.

That is not necessarily the case for our comrades in Latin America, where religion still holds a great deal of power and many of the civil rights and casual "out" activities we sometimes take for granted are very much in flux (although marriage between LGBTQ+ folx is now legal in Mexico) and associating with a gay organization is still a dangerous undertaking. Recently, however, there has been an explosion of proud new gay choruses in Latin America.

First, there was the Puerto Vallarta Gay Men's Chorus, founded in 2012 in Southern California's favorite south of the border holiday spot. PVGMC was GALA's first Latinx member chorus, although they've since gone their own way after changes in leadership. A great leap forward happened in 2014, when we received messages from a new chorus in Mexico City, Coro Gay Ciudad de Mexico.



With a little encouragement, two of the chorus' leaders attended Festival 2016 in Denver, the group joined GALA and soon were participating in our External Relations Committee. Now, Coro's president Oscar Urtusástegui Brechtel is a member of GALA's Board of Directors! Being an activist in the global LGBTQ+ choral movement, Oscar starting hearing of other gay choruses popping up in Latin America, and in 2021, he took the initiative to gather them together in a virtual meeting to discuss the state of the movement and common concerns among the South American choruses.

Today, due in no small part to Oscar's good work, we now know of 14 gay choirs in Central and South America, seven of which we are proud to call members of GALA Choruses. In Mexico, the Puerto Vallarta chorus is still singing, and Coro Gay Ciudad de Mexico is growing and thriving. They're now joined by Mexican choruses Coro LGBT+ Sonora and Coro Gay de Tijuana. Two other Mexican choruses started up this year: Coro LGBTQ de Querétaro and Coro gay de Tuxtla Gutiérrez. GALA members in Central and South America include Corinos: Coro de la Diversidad de Quito in Ecuador, Coro Hombres Gay - Montevideo in Uruguay, Coro Iridis in Costa Rica, and Coro Gay de Lima in Peru. We are absolutely thrilled to have these intrepid choruses in the GALA family! We also send much encouragement to other LGBTQ+ choruses in Argentina (Coro de Hombres Gays de Rosario), Brazil (Coro Comunitário Igbtq de Brasilia in the capital city, and Coral Câmara LGBT do Brasil por Maestro Ettore Verissimo in São Paolo), and Chile (Coro Queer Chile in San Miguel).

We at GALA Choruses talk about the "global LGBTQ+ choral movement" and it is truly a world-wide phenomenon. Our friends in Legato count 152 European choruses as members, and there are now gay choruses in the Middle East and in South Africa. Our dear Canadian member choruses will join their nation's other queer and allied choruses next year in Halifax, Nova Scotia for the bilingual Unison Festival. GALA is sponsoring an American mass chorus at the Out & Loud & Proud Festival in Sydney this February, which will join about a dozen LGBTQ choirs from Australia, New Zealand, and other parts of Oceania. Remember Beijing Queer Chorus performing masked in Denver in 2016? They were the first out chorus in Asia; there are now 37 maskless member choirs of Proud Voices Asia looking forward to the next Hand-in-Hand LGBTQ choral festival in Hong Kong.

From those first furtive steps decades ago, the movement has grown tremendously. There are now approximately 500 LGBTQ choruses around the globe - on every continent - all raising their voices with pride, courage, hope and joy, working to make a world where all voices are free and slowly-but-surely making a world where people of all sexualities and genders can sing without fear. As Rev. Martin Luther King said at the 1968 March on Washington, "We shall overcome because the arc of the moral universe is long, but it bends toward justice." GALA Choruses and the LGBTQ+ communities in Central and South America are travelling loudly along that arc.





The Global Alliance of Queer Choirs (GAQC) was formed in 2022 to facilitate the ongoing work of the LGBTQ choral singing organizations from around the world. GALA Choruses is a founding member of the group which shares best practices, works together on festival scheduling and provides opportunities for international collaborations between our organizations and their member groups. The other founding members are LEGATO – European Association of LGBTQ+ Choirs, Out & Loud – Australia, New Zealand and Pacific Island LGBTIQ+ Choirs, Proud Voices – Asian LGBT Choir Network and Unison Choruses Canada. Each of the organizations produces a festival in its own region every couple of years.

Beyond coordinating festival dates, GAQC has begun a queer concert series entitled Global Momentum in which queer choirs from around the world show what life over the last couple of years has looked like for them. The first concert in the series was released in June 2022 and featured Coro Gay Cuidad de Mexico, Beijing Queer Chorus and Canberra Qwire.

During 2022 GAQC also released a handbook on collaborations and tours which shares best practices for cross cultural collaboration and travel. The handbook covers group discussions on exceptionalism, tips for planning and preparation, preparing your members logistically and culturally, tips and guidelines for group leaders and organizers and suggestions for post-event evaluations.

Projects planned for 2023 include a video presentation from all of the regional organization representatives introducing their groups which can be used to better educate all of our members about the breadth of LGBTQ singing around the world and Zoom interviews with each GAQC member group leadership to determine how GAQC can best serve their needs.















A New Harmony

Equity, Access, Belonging

A Workbook for GALA Choruses



GALA Choruses continues to offer resources to assist member choirs, and other organizations, in addressing Equity, Access and Belonging. To date, 73 choirs have requested downloads of the New Harmony workbook. In addition to choirs using this resource on their own, New Harmony facilitators have led 17 workshops with individual choruses to assist them in navigating conversations exploring the workbook topics.

New Harmony committee members were integrated into GALA's strategic planning process, working with each committee to help them define and shape goals connected to equity, access and belonging.

A second New Harmony workbook is scheduled for completion in February 2023 with five new topics:

- 1. Intergenerational Dynamics
- 2. Digital Accessibility
- 3. Conversations on Faith and Religion
- 4. Neurodiversity & Mental Health
- 5. Exploring American Exceptionalism

On March 23, 2023, a webinar is planned to introduce New Harmony Workbook II.

GALA Choruses Programming

Ash, outgoing Artistic Director of Transpose PDX, has been hired on a contract basis to launch a new **BIPOC Leadership Project**. This BIPOC-led initiative is designed to connect BIPOC leaders within GALA Choruses, create opportunities for listening, and design new programming based on the needs and ideas identified.





The 2023 Catherine Roma Commissioning Project is underway in collaboration with composer Elizabeth Alexander. The completion date is targeted for summer 2023 and the consortium commission will be performed at Festival 2024 in Minneapolis.

Gifts of the Pandemic Output Description: Output Description:

In spite of the trials and roadblocks for choirs, the pandemic created some unexpected ongoing learnings and "gifts" for our choruses. Many choruses are now streaming rehearsals, making rehearsals more accessible for singers who are sick or have occasional mobility issues. An entirely new worldwide audience has been created by more accessible options to live-stream and re-broadcast concerts.

During the pandemic many GALA choruses focused rehearsal time on exploring GALA's New Harmony resources and addressing equity, access and belonging as a chorus. This focus has continued as choirs are now meeting in person.

Tools such as better access to recorded rehearsal tracks, recorded rehearsals for reference, and use of Zoom for board and committee meetings have strengthened the infrastructure of many GALA choirs.

GALA Choruses Financial Update
